FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI



Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

The image of Mass being celebrated at a Mass Rock in Penal Times should touch us deeply. In this instance it is wintertime, there is snow on the ground and a group of people are huddled around a priest who is celebrating Mass. Nearby a few men are keeping watch because there are soldiers, known as Red Coats, in the distance. What that priest and his people are doing is dangerous and provocative because they are breaking the law. That picture should remind us of the fidelity of our ancestors, the sacrifices they made and their profound reverence for the Eucharist.

Our ancestors were men and women of courage, for whom the Mass was more precious than life itself. We can imagine the efforts they made - rising in the early hours of darkness and making their way barefoot through snow and rain to some secluded glen in order to take part in Mass. Even though they may not have been very well educated, they were able to relate to that notion of sacrifice that is central to the Mass, when we recall that Jesus gave his life unsparingly, that he did not count the cost and that he was willing to lay down his life. It was their conviction that they were uniting their struggle and pain to his self-offering to God the Father. Despite the terrible consequences of infringing the harsh penal laws of that time, those people treasured the Mass as the mainstay of their lives.

It would be a terrible shame then if we should insult the memory of those brave people and say, "the Mass is boring" or "I couldn't be bothered." And it would be an indictment of their faith and loyalty if I should say, "I don't go to Mass because I get nothing out of it."

On this special feast let us reflect on the centrality of the Mass and cultivate greater reverence - by blessing ourselves correctly, genuflecting properly and receiving Holy Communion with respect. And may we go from Mass, with joy in our hearts and a strong desire to love and serve the Lord.
